HELPFUL INFORMATION

Communications. The City broadcasts a community service program on Cable Channel 12. This program lists current activities and services available in the City; City website at www.painesville.com, Facebook and Twitter.

Recreation and Public Lands. A variety of programs and facilities are operated and maintained by the Recreation and Public Lands Department. Kiwanis Recreation Park is the largest facility where events such as softball games, baseball games, local Junior Olympics and the Fishing Derby take place. Veterans' Memorial Park is Downtown's focal point and the site of special events like Party in the Park and the Spirit of the Season. Neighborhood parks are located throughout the City.

The City offers year-round recreational programming. A summer day camp is available for children. Another popular year-round activity is the one hour-walking program. The Morse Avenue Community Center is an indoor facility where many programs and activities are held. For information about these and other facilities and programs, call (440) 392-5912.

The City has two municipal cemeteries. Inquiries regarding burial sites can be made to (440) 392-5912.

Recycling and Refuse Collection. Waste Management Services provides weekly refuse collection. Residents may select one of two service level options based on the amount of refuse generated by the household. Bulk items and appliances are collected at no extra charge on the regular pickup day. Refuse may not be set on the treelawn before 7 p.m. on the day before, nor containers left out after 7 p.m. on collection day. Utilities. The City of Painesville operates municipal electric, water, and sanitary sewer systems. New customers may apply for service at the Utilities Office located in City Hall. All utilities are included on one monthly bill. If you have billing questions, contact the Utilities Office at (440) 392-5797. In the event of sewer problems, notify Public Works at (440) 392-9676. Problems with water service can be directed to (440) 392-2975 and (440) 392-9565 after business hours. Other after hour calls and requests for more information should be directed to (440) 352-9301.

Power Outages. To report a power outage Monday—Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. please call (440) 392-6185. All other times please call (440) 392-5954.

LOCAL LAWS

Animals. Household pets, when outside, must be in an enclosed area or under the control of the owner at all times. A household may have no more than three (3) domestic animals of any kind. No farm animals are allowed to be kept in the City.

Building Permits. A permit is required for all construction including accessory structures, pools, and fences. Permits may be obtained through the Community Development Department

City Income Tax. Painesville has a 2% Municipal Income Tax. All persons earning income in the City, all businesses, and all residents having taxable income are subject to the tax. Painesville residents are granted 100% credit for municipal income tax paid to other communities. Curfew. The City's curfew restricts persons 12 and under from being out from 9:30 pm to 5 am; persons 13 to 17 years of age from 11 pm to 5 am; persons 17 and 18 years of age from midnight to 5 am.

Garage Sales. A registration is needed for all garage, yard or porch sales in the City. There is no fee for registration. Garage sales are limited to no longer than three (3) consecutive days and not issued to the same individual for a sale on the same parcel more than four (4) times in a calendar year. Garage sale signs are permitted only on the property where the sale is being held. Signs may not be posted at any street corner, treelawns, or utility poles.

Grass and Weed Control. Lawns and landscaping must not cause a negative or deteriorating effect on the surrounding neighborhood. Generally, grass must be maintained and controlled in height or growth. For more information, contact the Community Development Department at (440) 392-5931.

Home Occupations. Any professional office or service operation that is conducted out of a residence must be approved by the Community Development Department. For further information on the requirements for home occupations, contact the Community Development Department at (440) 392-5931.

House Numbers. All households are required to display their house numbers in a prominent location so that safety forces can quickly locate the site of an emergency.

Noise. No person or persons shall unreasonably create a noise disturbance within the City. Any noise that causes adverse effect after 9:00 p.m. and before 7:00 a.m. is prohibited.

Open Burning. Burning trash, brush, leaves, or building materials is not permitted without prior approval by the local EPA and the Fire Department.

Parking Regulations. Parking on City streets for longer than 16 continuous hours is not permitted. Parking on the treelawns or front yards is prohibited at all times. Signs indicate where other restrictions apply.

Property Maintenance. To preserve and maintain the housing stock in the City, a Property Maintenance Code has been established which sets standards for maintenance and appearance of all structures within the City. Contact the Community Development Department at (440) 392-5931 for additional information on property maintenance requirements.

Sidewalks. The owner, occupant or other persons having charge of any building or premises shall keep the sidewalk(s) adjacent to such building or premises in a clean condition, clear of overhanging vegetation, clear of snow in winter, and in good repair at all times.

Signs. Home for Sale signs are permitted only on the actual property that is for sale. Off-premises Open House, For Sale, For Sale by Owner, real estate and garage sale signs are not permitted and may be confiscated when observed by the City.

Snow and Ice Control. Main thoroughfares are given first priority for snow and ice control; residential neighborhoods are cleared when conditions warrant service. Snow and ice control questions should be directed to the Department of Public Works at (440) 392-9676. On street parking is prohibited when there is two inches or more of snow, sleet, hail or ice on the street.

Solicitors. The City regulates door-to-door solicitation. A permit is required under certain circumstances, and registration is necessary under all circumstances. Call the Community Development Department at (440) 392-5931 for more information.

Trees on Right-of-Way/Treelawn. The City requires property owners to maintain treelawns and has specific ordinances that must be followed when trimming; removing and planting trees in the right-of-way/treelawn. No owner/occupant of any premises shall permit vegetation to overhang or stand so near to a right-of-way or treelawn as to endanger users. Zoning. The City of Painesville is divided into zoning districts. Each district is regulated as to the permitted uses and to where you can build on your property. Information about zoning districts and setbacks can be obtained from the Community Development Department at (440) 392-5931.
