About mid-month I authorized a reverse 911 message to be sent out to 10,480 phones in the Painesville City area. The message was sent out because the police department was seeing an increase in the number of home burglaries. It appeared to police that multiple suspects or groups of suspects were roaming the neighborhoods throughout the county to include our city. Central Communications sent out the message that was pre-recorded to the residents warning them to close windows and lock doors as it appears the suspects were selecting homes that provided easy entry. We also asked our residents to help and call in suspicious persons. The following day two different suspects in two separate home invasions were arrested after alert resident's contacted police. Also several suspects from burglaries in other communities have been identified as burglary suspects in our city. Our Detectives have been working diligently with the other agencies and arrested suspects to connect them to many of our burglaries.
