Painesville Police Department hosted a training class from the Merit Group for “Tactical Meth Lab” this three day course instructed Lt. Powalie and Detective Ticel methods in identifying the different types of meth labs as well as the safest tactics when making an entry for a search warrant. Numerous Law Enforcement agencies from the area sent officers for this training which was held at the Lake Erie College. By hosting the course, our departments saved approximately one thousand dollars out of our training budget.

The Month of May 2012 the Painesville Police Department assisted in the International Cuisine held on Main St. providing two Community Service Officers to be present at the entire event. Chief Hager and Lt. Waterman attended a Condo-Association meeting for College Hills residents held at the Morley Library. Chief Hager and Lt. The Association was given guidance on starting up their own Block-Watch. The department provided Parade traffic control for the Memorial Day event. Officer Cueni conducted a bicycle training event for all the children at Maple Elementary that ride a bicycle to school, which culminated into a bike riding event with the children and Officer Cueni on 05-22-12. A Crime Free seminar was held on 05-24-12 held at the PPD and taught by Officer Cueni and CSO Nagy. Detective Levicki was awarded the Child Advocate of the Year (2011) award held at the Lake Farm Park and presented by the County Commissioners. Each year the Children Services workers of Lake County Children Services vote on who should receive this award.
