Officers attended fewer training hours this month as we regularly reduce training time for summer month. Two detectives and one patrol officer attended "First Responders to Sexual Assaults" training, which and there was no charge for tuition. Two of our defensive tactic instructors attended training covering "Liability and Use of Force". Community Service Officer / LEADS training coordinator attended updated LEADS training

Crime Prevention/Community engagement: Officer Cueni participated in the annual P.L.U.S. graduation at 3 of our public schools. P.L.U.S. is the county wide drug education class held for 5<sup>th</sup> graders. Officer Cueni also represented the PD at Caley Home annual softball/cookout held on their property. Officers and adult counselors are pitted against the teen residents. I along with Detective Bailey made an hour long personal and property protection presentation to approximately 15 senior citizens at the Painesville Senior Center.

I along with many area police and fire representatives attended and participated in a table top drill hosted by and at the Lubrizol plant. We worked through and were evaluated on our response to a scenario that included a chemical release.

The Department is continuing in its due diligence by working with other Lake County agencies on the new Public Safety Radio System. Lt. Waterman along with approximately 10 other local police and fire representatives traveled to Lucas County. There the group tested/evaluated multiple radio companies P25 compliant radios. Lucas County has a backbone system up and running, which is to be the same as that which is nearing completion in Lake County. This process is helping Police and Fire Chiefs select their new radios with the goal of possible regionalized purchase to possibly reduce final purchase prices.
