

RESOLUTION NO. 10-23

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (ODOT) FOR THE INSTALLATION OF NEW FIBER-OPTIC INTERCONNECT, VEHICLE DETECTION AND CENTRAL SYSTEM ALONG THE US-20/SR-283 CORRIDORS IN THE CITY OF PAINESVILLE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the public interest demands that the signals along the US-20 and SR-283 corridors be replaced in the City of Painesville; and

WHEREAS, on 15TH day of August, 2022, the City of Painesville (LPA) enacted legislation proposing cooperation with the Director of Transportation for the described project:

The project consists of upgrading traffic signals along the U.S. 20 and S.R. 283 corridors, including signage, pavement markings, vehicular detection, controllers, fiber-optic interconnection, a central system, and removal of a signal, lying within the City of Painesville; and

WHEREAS, the City of Painesville shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of Painesville previously passed Resolution 68-22 to authorize this project, but the bids came in 17% over the engineer's estimate and as a result, it is necessary to pass this Resolution to authorize the payment of the additional cost of \$130,060.00 and to authorize ODOT to go forward with the contract.

WHEREAS, the City of Painesville shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement within the city limits which is now estimated to be \$876,960.00, less the amount of Federal-Aid funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation.

The share of the cost of the LPA is now estimated in the amount of Five Hundred Nine Thousand Four Hundred Sixty and ---00/100 Dollars, (\$509,460.00), but said estimated amount is to be adjusted in order that the LPA's ultimate share of said improvement shall correspond with said percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Transportation has approved said legislation proposing cooperation and has caused to be made plans and specifications and an estimate of cost and expense for improving the above described highway and has transmitted copies of the same to this legislative authority; and

WHEREAS, the LPA desires the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAINESVILLE, LAKE COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION I. That the estimated sum of Five Hundred Nine Thousand Four Hundred Sixty and ---00/100 Dollars, (\$509,460.00) is hereby appropriated for the improvement described above and the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to issue an order on the Finance Director for said sum upon the requisition of the Director of Transportation to pay the cost and expense of said improvement. We hereby agree to

assume in the first instance, the share of the cost and expense over and above the amount to be paid from Federal funds.

SECTION II. The City of Painesville (LPA) hereby requests the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.

SECTION III. The City of Painesville (LPA) enter into a contract or modification of the existing contract with the State, and that City Manager be, and is hereby authorized to execute said contract; providing for the payment of the LPA the sum of money set forth herein above for improving the described project.

SECTION IV. The City of Painesville (LPA) transmit to the Director of Transportation a fully executed copy of this Resolution.

SECTION V. That this Resolution is passed as an emergency measure for the protection and preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Painesville, the emergency being to expedite the highway project and to promote highway safety immediate passage is necessary so as to meet filing deadlines, and; therefore, this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
